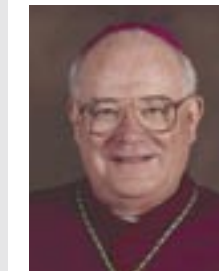

RAY FLYNN was appointed U.S. Ambassador to the Vatican (1993-1997), following three terms as the streetwise mayor of Boston. He also served as President of the U.S. Conference of Mayors.

Ambassador Flynn is the best-selling author of *The Accidental Pope* and *John Paul II, a Personal Portrait of the Pope and the Man*. When John Paul II died, he reported on the pope's

funeral and conclave and the inauguration of Benedict XVI. Flynn has keen insights on the characters of both popes, as well as the political pressures affecting the Vatican, the U.S. and global issues.

Flynn is a leading lay Catholic voice in the United States and is notably outspoken on issues of Faithful Citizenship for American Catholics, including social and economic justice, the dignity of the individual, the sanctity of human life, and the importance of preserving traditional marriage for the future of the American family. He is a regular guest on major network talk shows.



MARK BRUMLEY is President and CEO of Ignatius Press, the primary English language publisher of Pope Benedict XVI. Mark is a prolific writer and popular speaker.

He is author of *How Not to Share Your Faith* (Catholic Answers), and associate publisher of the online magazine *IgnatiusInsight.com*. He has spoken in hundreds of parishes throughout the United States and is a regular guest on the radio program *Catholic Answers Live*. His articles

have appeared in such publications as *National Review Online*, *Catholic World Report*, the *National Catholic Register*, *This Rock*, and *The Catholic Answer*.

He holds a Master's degree in theology from the University of Dallas. Mark and his wife Debbie live in Napa, California.

NOEL IRWIN HENTSCHEL is an entrepreneur committed to a life of service. She is the Chairman, CEO and Co-Founder of American Tours International (ATI), annually serving nearly one million visitors from more than 70 countries. ATI is the second largest woman-owned business in Los Angeles County and the largest inbound tour operator in the nation. ATI generates nearly \$3 billion into the U.S. economy yearly.

ATI has strategic alliance partnerships with AAA and CAA to provide online travel services for their 50 million members. A recent independent study for online travel lauded the hotel rates offered to AAA members by ATI as being "absolutely the best." The *Los Angeles Times* cited the ATIU/Univision website as the most comprehensive Spanish-speaking site for travel.

Noel is Vice Chair of the U.S. Travel and Tourism Advisory Board and Chair of the Strategic Alliance Committee, and is tourism advisor to the Secretary of Commerce. In 1988, Noel began working with Mother Teresa and her Missionaries of Charity in Calcutta. Today, The Noel Foundation humbly serves the Missionaries of Charity in Asia, Mexico and California.

Success Magazine named her as one of America's leading women entrepreneurs, ranking her with Oprah Winfrey and Martha Stewart, and *Time Magazine* called her a "local hero" for service in South Central Los Angeles where she accompanies sheriffs on ride alongs and provides Education Through Travel programs to help prevent youth from joining gangs.

Noel attended Notre Dame Academy. She was born in Fresno, California, grew up in South Los Angeles and is the eldest of 10 children. Noel and her husband, Gordon, are the parents of seven children. They live in Los Angeles and Carmel Valley, where they own and operate Stonepine Estate Resort.



PATRICK LENCIONI is founder and president of The Table Group, Inc., a specialized management-consulting firm focused on executive team-development and organizational health. He has been described by the *One-Minute Manager's* Ken Blanchard as "fast defining the next generation of business thinkers."
